Annual Leadership Dinner Focuses on Parish Master Planning

On Tuesday, May 2, approximately 100 Presentation parishioners involved in the various ministries and leadership groups of our parish gathered for the annual Leadership Dinner. This gathering is an opportunity to thank those who provide leadership and support throughout the year. We also take time to focus on important issues that affect the vision and direction of the parish.

For the past year, the Pastoral Council has been studying the Master Plan for our parish that was put together about eight years ago. It is suggested that a healthy, growing parish like Presentation revisit and update their Master Plan every 3-5 years. This summer will mark the 5-year Anniversary of the completion of Phase 1 of the Master Plan which included the renovation of our church worship space and the new addition to our school.

Some of the projects suggested for Phase 2 of the Plan are: a dedicated Parish Hall with meeting spaces, new Parish Offices, additional kitchen facilities, and additional spaces for our school and education ministries. The Pastoral Council along with the parish staff have spent time discussing whether our current physical spaces best serve our growing congregation while also looking at the Master Plan to set priorities for future needs.

The Leadership Dinner this year provided an opportunity to further this discussion and get some input from some of our leaders. The evening included a video presentation of all the buildings and meeting spaces on our campus and how these spaces are used by our parish ministries and groups. The video highlighted that Presentation has a large campus with a number of buildings of

a variety of ages that are well used from early morning to late in the evening. The meeting concluded with some next steps for continuing the process. The parish will be working with some design architects this summer to look at possible options for the items mentioned in Phase 2 of the Master Plan.

As the process progresses, all parishioners will be invited to give input and help decide the direction we take. Stay tuned for more information about this exciting time in our parish.
